YELLOW TICKETS

Yellow tickets are given to students for common area (cafeteria, lines, hallway, bathroom, etc) behaviors. Whether it is standing in line quietly or using the right voice level at lunch time, these tickets get counted at the end of each month and can be used to buy things in our PBIS store.

BLUE TICKETS

Blue tickets are handed out during recess time from the recess teachers and helpers. They are also saved up during the month and students can use them to buy things from our PBIS store.

PURPLE TICKETS

Purple tickets are extra special and can only be handed out by substitute teachers. If your student receives a purple ticket, they can hand it in for five yellow tickets.

GREEN TICKETS

Green tickets are handed out in classrooms for displaying respectful, responsible, safe and caring behaviors. A few examples of green ticket behavior would be working quietly, raising your hand and helping other students.

RED TICKETS

Red tickets are given to entire classes that display Lion Basics (Respectful, Responsible, Safe and Caring) These are highly coveted and when a class earns a certain number, they get to choose a whole class reward such as a pajama party or movie day.

WHAT IS IT?

PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports. It is a positive and proactive way to deal with student behavior. Students or entire classes are acknowledged for doing "the right thing" with tickets of different colors depending on the area or situation. At Lisbon we focus on teaching students to be respectful, responsible, safe and caring throughout the school. Expectations are taught to students and there are signs throughout the school

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- * Talk with your student about Lion Basics. Ask them what it is and how they are accomplishing these goals.*
- * Ask your child's teacher how you can help in the classroom. Donate prizes and time.*
- * Use the "magic words" at home (respectful, responsible, safe and caring) as well as encouraging good manners.*
- * Keep in touch with your child's teachers, communication is key.*
- * Ask them about their day and make sure they are ready to go each morning.*
